## ○ **malingering** [noun]

Definition : to avoid work by pretending to be ill

Example Sentence : I think it's actually quite rare to have both malingering and generalized anxiety disorder, because malingering tends to make me feel very anxious.

## ○ **psychiatry** [noun]

Definition : The study and treatment of mental illnesses

Example Sentence : Psychiatry profession has a kind of strange desire to label what's essentially normal human behavior as a mental disorder.

## ○ **glib** [adjective]

Definition : said easily and without thinking about all the problems involved

Example Sentence : I know this will sound glib, but don't pretend you aren't feeling what you feel.

## ○ **grandiose** [adjective]

Definition : Very important or impressive, but are not practical

Example Sentence : classic psychopath — speaks to items one and two on the checklist: glibness, superficial charm and grandiose sense of self-worth.

## ○ **anomaly** [noun]

Definition : Something that is noticeable because it is different from what is usual

Example Sentence : But on one such mission they came across a startling anomaly.

## ○ **intrigue** [verb]

Definition : Interests a person a lot because it seems strange or mysterious

Example Sentence : He looked intrigued despite himself, and he said, "Okay, go on."

# ANSWERS



A1.

**Those who chose 1... "ordinary person"**

You have ordinal personality.

You are a normal person in the good sense of the word, with no apparent psychopathic elements. However, it is difficult to remain normal, so you never know when you will see your psychopathic side.

**Those who chose 2... "The buck passer type"**

You have 70% psychopathic element.

When you get into trouble, you tend to shift the blame to others and to be self-protective.

You are a smart person, so you have the potential to be very successful if you change the situations in which you use your head.

**Those who chose 3, you are... "The skeptic type"**

You have 95% psychopathic elements.

Even if you are smiling and laughing on the surface, you are paranoid that others may have a negative image of you.

**Those who chose 4... "contrary type"**

The psychopathic element is low at 35%.

You are a cynical person who cannot honestly believe what others say.

You are a cynical person who does not believe what others say.

**Those who chose 1 ... "person who prioritizes emotions."**

The psychopathic element is 35%. You have a kind and caring nature.

However, you are so concerned about your feelings that you lack consideration for others and social skills...Therefore, your words and actions may have a negative effect on you at times.

**Those who chose 2 ... "person who lacks a sense of responsibility"**

The psychopathic element is 70%. You seem to act according to your moods and impulses.

**Those who chose 3 ... "person who can read between the lines"**

The psychopathic element is 10%. You seem to be able to come to terms with your emotions and their impact on those around you.

You have a subconscious desire not to be disliked, so you act with the understanding of the situation.

**Those who chose 4 ... "person who cannot predict the future"**

**Those who chose 3 ... 10% psychopathic element!**

You are able to sympathize and agree with others, and you have a low psychopathic element.



# **ANSWERS TO THE QUESTIONS**
